- 1) How will we be "caught up?" (17)
- 2) How does this encourage us? (18)

Questions for Discussion:

- What things stood out to you from today's passage?
- What things did you find challenging or confusing?
- There is a regularly-occurring *already* (now) and *not*—*yet* (future) dynamic in this letter. What other examples do we have in Scripture of things that are *already* experienced and still *not*—*yet* fulfilled?
- Why is it a comfort to Christians that we experience heavenly blessings *now*? Why is it also a comfort to long for those things we *not-yet* experience? Give specific examples.
- What is the difference between the fear of being left behind –vs– the hope of our future resurrection? Why does this greatly matter for the church?
- If Christ rose bodily, how is He still with us even now? (see Matt 28:20)
- We live in a world with sickness and death all around us. How do we "encourage one another with these words?"

> "rapture" = rapio (Latin) = harpazō (Greek)

"to meet" \approx apentēsis \approx a formal welcome
